

Basic Cabinet Care

- As with all wood products, avoid excessive moisture on your wood cabinets.
- Clean any spills as soon as they occur using a damp cloth and dry immediately with a soft cloth.
- For regular dusting, dampen a microfiber cloth and lightly wipe the cabinet door.
- Clean regularly with N-Hance Cabinet Cleaner (details in right column).
- If you need to clean cabinet hardware, remove them from cabinet doors and drawers in order to protect wood surfaces from harsh chemicals.
- Do not use petroleum type cleaners or those containing ammonia, bleach, wax, silicone, alcohol or abrasives. The use of these products may damage the finish on your wood cabinets. Abrasives such as sandpaper, steel wool, scouring pads and wire brushes should never be used on cabinets.
- Do not use knives and sharp objects to clean your cabinets. N-Hance recommends using the bone scraper included in your kit.

Avoid these damaging elements



Water & Grease:

Water and grease may seem harmless, but over time they can eventually break down the protective coating and the finish may start flaking away from the wood surface. Never allow water to stay on your cabinets. Quickly remove it with a towel by blotting, not wiping.



Damp Towels:

Avoid draping a damp towel over your cabinet doors. This traps the moisture and will eventually penetrate through the finish. Flaking and racking will most certainly happen if towels are not removed.



Steam:

Steam from the dishwasher or shower will also permeate through a finish, resulting in cracking, discoloration and peeling. To help prevent steam damage, wipe down wet surfaces and clean regularly with N-Hance Cabinet Cleaner.



Cleaning Your Cabinets:

Your N-Hance Cabinet Cleaner can be sprayed onto any hard surface to remove food, dirt, and grease from your cabinets. (Always test in an inconspicuous area first to reduce damage if any may occur.)

Step 1: Remove the lid, hold can upright approximately 8 inches away, and spray desired cabinet.

Step 2: Wait 10 seconds for the cleaner to emulsify the soiled area.

Step 3: Blot with a towel and remove the spot.

Step 4: Repeat steps 1-4 as needed.

Touching-up Your Cabinets:

Accidents are unavoidable and can occur at any time. If a chip or scratch creates a blemish on a cabinet door, it can be repaired easily with a bottle of N-Hance touch-up. (Always test in an inconspicuous area first.)

Step 1: Clean damaged area first before touch-up. (refer to cleaning steps.)

Step 2: Remove lid from touch-up bottle and brush the color into the damaged area. (Only brush over the area missing color.)

Step 3: After the first coat is dry, re-apply a second coat if needed.
