

Basic Floor Care

Regular maintenance is the best defense against nasty floor buildup and a dull appearance. Remember that no finish will last forever. Talk with your N-Hance Wood Renewal Expert about a maintenance program that is right for you to ensure that your floors and all the wood in your home is protected.



Sweep or dust up daily if possible. Avoid the use of tough bristle brooms and vacuums and tools that are hard and may cause potential damage to floors.



Floor mats are the best way to minimize grit from entering your home from the outside. Avoid mats that have a vinyl, plastic, or rubber backing that can trap and keep moisture under the mat. Place mats on both the outside and inside of entries.



When moving furniture, never drag or pull across floors. When possible, completely lift the item into place. Felt pads (not nylon or other materials) should be secured to all furniture that is in contact with floors. Replace pads every three months to ensure adequate protection.



Walk on floors in stocking feet only and keep pets and pet dishes off floors. Stocking feet are preferred even over bare feet since the oil from the body can work against the sealer and finish on floors. Avoid wearing high heels on your floors and keep pets nails' clipped short.



Sun can damage your floors and cause a yellow or "washed out" appearance. It is recommended that you use a sheer liner inside your drapes to deflect the ultraviolet rays from harshly affecting your floors' finish.



Quickly absorb spills with a clean, dry soft terry cloth towel. If a "sticky" residue remains, use a separate clean, water-dampened terry cloth towel to wipe up the sticky residue (or use N-Hance Professional Wood Floor Cleaner). Never use steel wool or any abrasive material to clean your floors.



Do not use any cleaning products that contain petroleum, waxes or vegetable oil soaps. The best cleaning products for your wood are neutral pH. Your N-Hance Wood Renewal Expert can offer you a neutral pH cleaning product designed to be absolutely compatible with our N-Hance process and finishes.



Drips and leaks from faucets, ice machines, house plants with wicker baskets around them and even open windows can allow moisture that can sit on your floor and leave permanent markings.

After Service Care:

Following the departure of your N-Hance Wood Renewal Expert, we leave the care and maintenance of your beautifully restored floors in your hands. Here are tips to ensure that your floors remain beautiful:

The First 3 Hours...

- Immediately following service, please leave all the floors completely undisturbed for a minimum of 3 hours. During this time, the floors should not be walked on or accessed in any manner.

The first 24 hours...

- Your renewed floors need to "cure" for at least 24 hours before replacing any furniture.
- All furniture should have felt pads secured before replacing furniture.
- Never drag furniture - always lift when moving.

The first 3 days...

After your floors have cured for the recommended minimum of 3 days, you may start doing the following:

- Sweeping or dust mopping
- Replacing inside mats and area rugs
- Walking on floors with shoes or bare feet. Wear stockings or socks the first 3 days to protect floor during curing process.

After 7 days...

- Do not allow pets (and their dishes) back on the floor for 7 days. Keep your pets' nails trimmed to prevent scratching on your floor.
